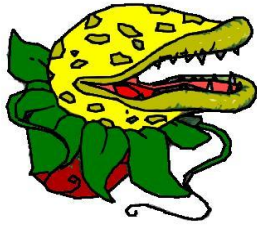


## Fall Concert
